**Evolutionary chart of cats** and dogs that were taken in





### When are they recovered?

**Unwanted litters** 

The keys

- Think carefully before
- acquiring a pet Sterilise to avoid litters you
- can't support Identify to recover if lost
- Train to improve behaviour
- Adopt to give them a home and make room for other animals
